## **Northern Ireland UK Youth Parliament Programme and Upcoming Elections**

- Registrations to run as a MYP close on the 20/9/24 at 2pm and elections will be held online shortly after this date
- The previous contract holder, the British Youth Council, have been replaced by the National Youth Agency (NYA)
- Members of Youth Parliament (MYP's) are elected every 2 years from across the UK. Once elected, Members of Youth Parliament meet with MLAs, MPs and local councillors, organise events, run campaigns, make speeches, hold debates, and ensure the views of young people are listened to by decision makers.
- MYP's will be able to attend the Annual Conference of the UKYP (26/27 October 2024 in Warwick). And they will also be able to attend the Annual Sitting in the UK Parliament, sitting on and speaking from, the benches of the House of Commons (March 2025 date to be confirmed).
- All events, travel and accommodation are paid for by the programme.
- Candidates must be aged 11-18 years old at the commencement of their term of office. They must live, work, be educated or volunteer in the constituency in which they stand for election for 14+ hours a week to be eligible.
- MYPs from NI will meet virtually several times a month and attend in-person events every two months
- No previous experience is required
